- \$3,000 towards tuition of (2) students attending Oakland Catholic HS. (Saints John & Paul)

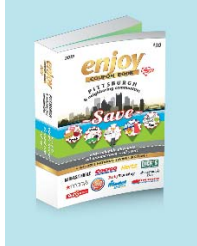

The Story of the "Silver Rose"

Each year, to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Culture of Life the Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States, and Mexico circulate five Silver Roses throughout all three countries. These five Roses start their journeys every April in London, Ontario. Each Rose takes a separate route but collectively these five roses visit nearly all-of the Canadian Provinces and American States by December. In early December four of the Roses enter Mexico for further visitation, ending in the Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe for Her Feast Day on December 12th. The fifth Rose ends its journey at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT (the founding parish of the Knights of Columbus) also on December 12th.

Roses, long associated with Our Blessed Mother throughout history, is also, a symbol of the Culture of Life. In 1960 the Columbian Squires, the Youth Organization of the Knights of Columbus ran live roses throughout Mexico. Impressed by their valor, Bishop John Cody of London, Ontario commissioned a Bronze Rose in in 1961 and sent it to Mexico. Mexican Knights and Squires, soon afterward, adopted the "Silver Rose" as an international project and increased the number of Roses to five so that more people could participate in the annual "Running of the Roses".

I see this as an opportunity to work with the officers and program chairmen to **enhance the charitable and community work that we already do**. Remember the saying: "when one door closes, another is opened"
